MG422 – Lambda Foundation of Excellence fonds

Fonds consists of the administrative records of the Lambda Foundation for Excellence and which includes: Wilde About Sappho files, articles, author press kits, and paraphernalia; Pride InfoFairs information; Lambda Foundation for Excellence National Human Rights awards files; Pride in the Capital files; Board of Directors meetings which detail minutes, financial statements, mutual fund reports, correspondence, constitution & by-laws, charitable status, volunteers, corporate planning and corporate sponsorship, university scholarships, patrons, fundraisers, mailouts, advertising, and business plans.

The collection also consists of related material from the Gay and Lesbian community such as: Lesbian & Gay Expo 2000; Capital Xtra and other related newspapers and news clippings; E.G.A.L.E. [Equality for Gays & Lesbians Everywhere] reports and lobbying kits; Canadian AIDS Society publications; HIV/AIDS articles and conferences; 1999 Ottawa Gay & Lesbian business directory ('In the Pink'); Bruce House newsletters; Ottawa Gay Men's Chorus programs; and PRIDE events.

MG914 – Gary Sealey fonds

The fonds contains records that document the life of Gary Sealey. The records document his childhood, education, advocacy, work, and family, dating from 1919 to 2017. The records have been arranged into the following series: Personal Life, Family, and Advocacy.

The records that reflect Gary's advocacy document his involvement with 2SLGBTQ+ groups and organizations. These records are largely composed of newsletters, brochures, mailouts, and clippings.

MG987 – Pride Committee of Ottawa – Gatineau fonds

The fonds contains records that document the history and activities of the Pride Committee of Ottawa-Gatineau from the mid-1990s to the 2014. These records include

the organization's administrative records, along with records that reflect the planning and execution of annual Pride festivities, including its InfoFair, the parade, street festival, picnics, parties and fundraisers.

The fonds also contains some records that document the partnerships that the Pride Committee of Ottawa-Gatineau had with other festival-based organizations and 2SLGBTQ+ organizations from across North America.

MG1007 - Philip Hannan fonds [Work on this collection is in progress, so it may not be available for research. There are access restrictions on portions of this collection.]

The fonds consists of records created and accumulated by Philip Hannan as a teenager until his early 60s. The fonds reflects his life as a student, photographer, journalist, editor, activist and government employee and brings life to the queer community in Ottawa and Canada, especially during the HIV/AIDS epidemic.

MG1044 - Paul "Peaches Latour" Fournier fonds

The fonds contains records documenting the personal life of Paul Fournier and his drag persona Peaches Latour from the 1940s to the 2000s. The fonds is primarily composed of photographs that have been organized into 3 photo albums.

RG007-11 Records of Mayor Marion Dewar

File contains materials from 1992 related to updating the City of Gloucester benefits program so that same-sex spouses would be eligible for benefits coverage. There is also supporting documentation regarding decisions on this issue that had been made in other parts of Ontario.

File contains information pertaining to a decision by City Council to withdraw their endorsement of Lesbian and Gay Pride Day in 1990, resulting in a human rights complaint and hearings in the Supreme Court of Ontario. Also contains a petition to have June 23, 1991, be proclaimed as Lesbian and Gay Pride Day .

1992-2370 Barcode 92377. Homosexuals – Gays of Ottawa MO001-EB04700/0110. File contains correspondence regarding the decision of the City not to proclaim Gay Pride Day in 1990, a paper called Homosexuality and Public Policy: The Myth of Legitimate Minority Status, articles and pamphlets about AIDS, plans for a Pride Parade in 1989 – includes an invitation to the Mayor with a request to proclaim June 18, 1989 Pride Day, request for a Pride day proclamation in 1987 (letter is dated 1986), a letter regarding blood transfusions, and an information document from Gays of Ottawa.

1992-2370 Barcode 92378. Proclamation – Pride Day – Gays & Lesbians – Gays of Ottawa MO001-EB04700/0200. File contains correspondence from EGALE regarding trying to have the Canadian Human Rights Act amended, materials related to a human

rights complaint regarding the proclamation and rescinding of Lesbian and Gay Pride Day in 1990. There is also correspondence both in support and against the issue.

File contains materials related to a grant application for the 1993 Making Scenes film festival. There is support material with information about the organization and a copy of the program for the 1992 festival.

1994-3086OT Barcode 711215. EW001-ZZA0145/20/C045 Corporate Advisory Committee on Sexual Orientation – Committees. File contains material related to the establishment of the Corporate Advisory Committee on Sexual Orientation, and their mandate. File is from 1988.

There is a survey of information from insurance companies looking at the implications of making this change. Also contains City of Ottawa documents from September 1991 about same-sex benefits.

1996-0059OT Barcode 400344. – RE001-XLC3689/0480 Festival Assistance Program Administration – Making Scenes Gay & Lesbian Film / Video Collective. File contains materials related to the Making Scenes Film Festival and includes documentation regarding their grant applications for 1992, 1993 and 1994.

1996-0063OT Barcode 685889. – RE001-XLC3689/0480: 1994 Lesbian and Gay Film & Video Festival. File contains material related to the grant applications for the Making Scenes film festival for 1994 and 1995.

1996-1127OT, Barcode 0430257. Lesbian and Gay Pride Day – Proclamations MO004-EBB8500/0200 vol. 1, vol. 2. File contains correspondence newspaper clippings, and associated materials related to the City's decision to proclaim Lesbian and Gay Pride Week in Ottawa in 1992. There are materials both supporting and against this decision. There are also materials related to proclamations from 1993-1997. There are some envelopes in the second volume of the file that indicate they contain confidential information – these will need to be reviewed before access can be provided to a researcher.

1996-1615OT, Barcode 673204. MO004-EBO4700/0200 Same Sex Couples – Homosexuals. File contains materials related to Bill 167, the 1994 Equality Rights

Statute Amendment Act for same-sex couples which did not pass in the Ontario Provincial Legislature. There is a copy the proposed legislation with a chart of what other pieces of legislation would have been amended by this act if it had passed. There is also a letter and an envelope of material in the file sent to the Mayor regarding the legislation by two women who were not in favour of the legislation passing. Please note: Much of the supplemental material in the brown envelope present views and opinions that are homophobic.

The rescinding of the Gay Pride proclamation in 1990 resulted in a human rights complaint, the file contains material related to that complaint. There is also some correspondence to Diane Holmes, and an article about festival funding for the Lesbian and Gay Film & Video Festival.

File contains information about the Pride parade and picnic planned for 1993, a copy of the Triangle newsletter, materials regarding Pride Week 1992 Mayor's address to the LAMBDA dinner on January 21, 1992, a letter to Councillor Nancy Mitchell, newspaper article about Pride Week, a letter to the Mayor opposing Pride Week, and a letter to the Pride Week Committee about their parade route for 1994.

File contains materials related to the festival's 1995 grant application. There are examples of a ticket, poster, brochure, and a copy the 1994 festival program. Also contains 1 issue of Capital Xtra dates March 24, 1994.

1998-1278 Barcode 0720818. Lesbian and Gay Pride Day – Proclamations MO004-EBB8500/0200 vol. 3. File contains materials related to Pride Week proclamations, and human rights complaints related to Pride Week Proclamations in the 1990s. There are also letters related to festival funding, and newspaper clippings from various publications.

1998-2019OT Barcode 557482. LE001-PSF3070/0110 Human Rights Gays / Visible Minorities – Firefighters Recruitment Program: Issues. File contains materials related to an inquiry received in 1993 about what types of questions are permissible to ask as part of a job application process. The only time it is permissible to ask questions about if someone is part of a marginalized community is if it is part of an employment equity program. File contains opinions for the Legal Department on these issues.

1998-2253OT Barcode 960016. RE050-RFK1100/1997-0615 (239) – Special Permit #239: Minto Park – International Lesbian Week (97/10/03). File contains a permit application and approval to use Minto Park for an International Lesbian Week events on October 3 and October 4, 1997.

1998-2283OT Barcode 785586. CG560-XLC4165/0100 OC Police Liaison Cttee: Lesbian Gay Bisexual Etc. Community Services Group. File contains information about the Ottawa-Carleton Police Liaison Committee for Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, and Transgender Communities. There is a fact sheet about the committee and minutes from their meeting dated March 20, 1995.

1999-0557OT, Barcode 936658. CG071-ACS1997/1125-025 – Proclamation – Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender Pride Week – July 12-20, 1997. File contains information about the proclamation for 1997, past proclamations, and includes references to human rights complaints.

1999-0831OT Barcode 998246. RE702-RFL1996/0545 Pride Week: Rainbow Party – Events By Year – Lansdowne Park Site. File contains the rental agreement and information related to the Pride Week Party being held at the Coliseum building at Lansdowne Park in 1996.

File contains materials relating to the Making Scenes Film Festival for 1996. File contains information regarding events planned as part of the 1997 Pride Festival, and a request to extend the hours permitted on the special occasion liquor permit for the opening party at Lansdowne Park.

2000-1760OT Barcode 1029765. RE001-XLC4235/0440-1998 Cultural Assistance Administration: 1998 – Pride Week. File contains materials related to the 1998 grant application. There is a significant amount of supporting documentation that contains information about the 1997 Pride Week Festival including the program of events.

2000-2233OT Barcode 998247. RE702-RFL1997/0545 Pride Week: Rainbow Party – Events By Year – Lansdowne Park Site. File contains materials related to the rental agreements and arrangements for the 1997 Rainbow Party at Lansdowne Park.

2000-2500OT Barcode 1058726. RE001-XLC4235/0440-1999: 1999 – Pride Week. File contains materials related to the 1999 grant application for Pride Week.

File contains materials related to their 1999 grant application. Support materials include information about the 1998 festival including the program, and a chocolate bar that had been made specifically for the festival. [We kept the chocolate bar wrapper, but we had to dispose of the chocolate itself as it was 27 years old at the time this file was reviewed for inclusion in this document]. Also includes a copy of the 1999 festival program.

2000-2550OT Barcode 762648. LE001-AIM9045/0110 Proclamations: Civic Holidays / Special Days / Weeks – Corporate Administration: Information & Publicity. File contains materials about various proclamations and holidays being proposed by the City of Ottawa between 1990 to 1995. There are several articles and references related to Pride Week and what it should be called, as well as information related to the decision in 1990 to rescind the Gay and Lesbian Pride Day proclamation, which in turn led to a human rights complaint being filed against the City of Ottawa. There is also information about a proposed proclamations policy.

2000-2550OT Barcode 1030784. LE001-AIM9045/0110-1997 Proclamations: Civic Holidays / Special Days / Weeks – Corporate Administration: Information & Publicity. File contains materials related to the Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual and Transgender, Pride Week proclamation for July 12-20, 1997. There is also a chart of previous proclamation terminology requested, and the responses of the Mayor and City Council for most of the early to mid 1990s. The file also references the human rights complaint against Mayor Jacqueline Holtzman from 1993 as the proclamation that year did not contain all the terms that had been requested.

File contains letters from Pink Triangle Services, information regarding the settlement of a human rights complaint against Mayor Jacquelin Holtzman, the 1997 Pride program, information about the 1996 Pride Festival, an issue of Notes from the Underground: Ottawa's Transcommunity Voice from July 1995, an issue of GO Info from May 1995, and letters to Councillor Ron Kolbus about advertising for Pride Week and the Making Scenes film festival. Material in the file dates from 1995-1997.

2001-0146, Barcode 1082862. CG071-ACS1999/CC-CSO-0012 – Pride Festival – July 10, 1999 – Extension of Hours Lansdowne Park – Licences & Permits. File contains information pertaining to the request to extend the hours permitted on the special occasion liquor permit for the 1999 Pride Festival opening event at Lansdowne Park.

File contains materials related to the extension of benefits to same sex couples for the City of Ottawa. There are support materials from other agencies, memos and documents related to employee insurance plans.

File contains materials related to the Pride Festival's Economic Development grant application for 2000. There are copies of the festival programs for 1998 and 1999 included as support materials for the application.

2002-8786 Barcode 609057. LE004-LTO3165/0110 Human Rights Code – Act: Ontario. File contains information about the Ontario Human Rights Code with regards to city contractors, Pride Week proclamations, cases of discrimination on the basis on sexual orientation, issuing proclamations, religious holidays, and the complaint made against the City of Ottawa in 1990. Most material in the file dates between 1990 to 1995.

2003-1191 Barcode 1399913. XW001-XMM4100/0007356 By-Laws and Council: Proclamations – 1998 – West Carleton: Township Of. File contains materials related to proclamation requests received by the Township of West Carleton in 1998, and their decision that year to stop issuing proclamations. There are also newspaper articles that indicate some people thought that not issuing proclamations at all was a cop out so that they wouldn't need to decide whether or not to issue a proclamation for Pride Week in 1998.
