Report on Form 4 Financial Statement

Qualified Opinion

We have audited the accompanying Form 4 Financial Statement of Alysha Aziz, Candidate, which comprise the Statement of Campaign Income and Expenses, Calculation of Surplus or Deficit and the Schedules of Contributions and Fundraising Events and Activities for the period from the date of filing of nomination August 17, 2022, to December 31, 2022. The financial statements have been prepared by the candidate Alysha Aziz, Zone 2 – OCDSB Trustee.

In our opinion, except for the possible effects of the matter described below in the Basis for Qualified Opinion, the Form 4 Financial Statement presents fairly, in all material respects, the financial information reflected in the accounting records of Candidate Alysha Aziz in accordance with the financial reporting requirements outlined in the 2022 Candidates' guide for Ontario municipal council and school board elections by the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing and the Municipal Elections Act, 1996.

Basis for Qualified Opinion

Candidates derive revenues from donations, including donations of goods and services, the completeness of which is not susceptible to satisfactory audit verification. Accordingly, in accordance with the guidance outlined in the 2022 Candidates' guide for Ontario municipal council and school board elections provided by the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing, our verification of these transactions was limited to ensuring that the financial statement reflected the amounts recorded in the accounting records of the Candidate in accordance with the accounting procedures established by the Municipal Elections Act, 1996 and we were not able to determine whether any adjustments might be necessary to campaign income and expenses, surplus/deficit, contributions and fundraising.

We conducted our audit in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statement section of our report. We are independent of the Alysha Aziz Election Campaign in accordance with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statement in Canada, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our qualified opinion.

The Form 4 Financial Statement is prepared to assist Candidate Alysha Aziz in meeting the financial reporting requirements outlined in the 2022 Candidates' guide for Ontario municipal council and school board elections provided by the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing and the Municipal Elections Act, 1996. As a result, the financial statement may not be suitable for another purpose.

Responsibilities of the Candidate for the Financial Statement

The Candidate is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statement in accordance with those requirements of the Financial Reporting Framework in Municipal Elections Act, 1996.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statement

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statement as a whole is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of this financial statement.

As part of an audit in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards, we exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit. We also:

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statement, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Candidate's internal control.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates, if any, and related disclosures made by management.
- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the financial statement, including the disclosures, and whether the financial statement represents the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.

We communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.
