# **Getting started**

The City of Ottawa Archives offers access to many primary and secondary resources in its corporate, community and reference collections that support genealogical research, with an emphasis on the history of the Ottawa region.

In addition, we partner with the local branches of several organizations that provide reference resources and services at the Archives to those interested in family histories. These include the Ontario Genealogical Society – Ottawa Branch (OBOGS), the British Isles Family History Society of Greater Ottawa (BIFHSGO), the United Church of Canada (UCC), and the United Empire Loyalists' Association of Canada – Sir Guy Carleton Branch (UELAC).

# United Church Archives Collection (Ottawa and the Seaway Valley Presbyteries)

Records of the Ontario congregations of the Ottawa and Seaway Valley Presbyteries of the United Church of Canada are housed at the City of Ottawa Archives.

Researchers can consult a listing of Marriage, Baptism and Burial Registers that have been deposited in the Montreal & Ottawa Conference collection at the City of Ottawa Archives. This listing includes pre-1925 registers of congregations that joined the United Church of Canada, as well as those for congregations which were formed after 1925. Registers that are still held by local churches are not included in this listing.

The Montreal & Ottawa Conference collection includes other sources of information on baptisms, marriages and burials which are not listed here. These consist of annual reports, Session minutes, Communion and Historic rolls.

An archivist is available on-site on a part-time basis. Appointments are recommended for in-person visits. Inquiries can be forwarded to the City of Ottawa Archives.

# United Empire Loyalists' Association of Canada – Sir Guy Carleton Branch Collection

The UEL Association's mission is to preserve, promote and celebrate the history and traditions of the Loyalist epoch in Canadian history. The Sir Guy Carleton branch library,

located at the City of Ottawa Archives, acquires books that relate to the Loyalists and their experience in Canada. This includes biographies; family histories; census, cemetery and vital records; military records; and histories of the American revolution, of the provinces where the Loyalists settled, and of the original 13 American colonies. The collection has now grown to over 800 books and 27 periodical titles.

Branch volunteers are available on-site on a part-time basis to provide research guidance. Contact the Archives for details.
