### **Active Transportation Fund**

The federal government's Active Transportation Fund is investing in projects to make travel by active transportation easier, safer, more convenient, and enjoyable. In 2023, the City of Ottawa received \$350,000 to fund seven feasibility studies. Two have been completed with final reporting submitted.

### **Community Sport and Recreation Infrastructure Fund - Stream 2**

The Community Sport and Recreation Infrastructure Fund, Stream 2, is funding both renewal of and new sports and recreation facilities in Ontario.

The City of Ottawa was approved to receive \$8,080,250 to build a new gymnasium at the Alexander Community Centre. Design is underway with construction expected to begin Spring 2026.

### **Enabling Accessibility Fund**

The Enabling Accessibility Fund provides funding for projects that make Canadian communities and workplaces more accessible for persons with disabilities.

In 2023, the City of Ottawa received a grant of \$100,000 to fund part of an accessibility retrofit project at the City of Ottawa's By-law and Regulatory Services headquarters; this project was completed November 2025.

### **FCM – Local Leadership in Climate Adaptation**

The Local Leadership for Climate Adaptation initiative provides funding support to local governments to adapt and build long-term resiliency to the impacts of climate change. Through the Adaptation in Action intake, the City of Ottawa has been awarded \$828,970 to complete two studies of climate adaptation projects and one implementation project that will improve municipal readiness for climate events.

### **Flood Hazard Identification and Mapping Program**

The Flood Hazard Identification and Mapping Program is investing in projects that will

complete flood maps for high-risk areas in Ontario and make them available to the public.

Since 2022, the City of Ottawa has secured \$1,143,856.63 to complete mapping for areas within the South Nation Conservation Authority and United Counties of Prescott and Russell.

### **Green and Inclusive Community Buildings**

The Green and Inclusive Community Buildings (GICB) program objective is to support green and accessible retrofits, repairs, or upgrades to existing public community buildings and the construction of new publicly accessible community buildings that serve high-needs, underserved communities across Canada.

In 2022, the City of Ottawa was approved for \$630,000 from the federal government through the GICB program for the deep retrofit of the Hintonburg Community Centre. The building will become net-zero ready from improvements to the building envelope and new heating, cooling, and ventilation systems. This project is expected to be completed in 2026.

### **Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program – Community Culture and Recreation Stream**

Since 2021, the City of Ottawa has been approved to receive \$39,194,666 from the federal and Provincial government to fund facility renovations and expansions, pool, and park projects.

### **Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program (ICIP) – COVID-19 Resiliency**

In 2021, the City of Ottawa was approved to receive \$19.2 million from the federal and Provincial government to fund retrofits, repairs and upgrades for municipal buildings, measures to support physical distancing, and projects to support active transportation such as parks, pathways, and bike lanes.

### **Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program, Public Transit Infrastructure Stream**

The Public Transit Infrastructure Stream (PTIS) supports the development and enhancement of transit networks across Canada, aiming to improve service, reduce emissions, and create jobs. PTIS contributed \$8,612,400 towards work on the Chief William Commanda Bridge project, which was completed in 2025.

### **Strategic Priorities Infrastructure Fund**

Funded by the Province of Ontario, the City of Ottawa received \$3,847,972 in 2022 to expand the Larry Robinson Arena. Design is underway with construction expected to start in 2026.

### **Zero Emission Vehicle Infrastructure Program**

The Zero Emission Vehicle Infrastructure Program addresses the lack of charging and hydrogen refueling stations in Canada by increasing the availability of localized charging and hydrogen refueling opportunities where Canadians live, work, travel, and play. The City of Ottawa has been approved to receive \$170,000 towards the expansion of

the City's Public EV Charger Network, and \$430,000 towards the City's Fleet EV Charging Infrastructure.
