# city of ottawa cultural funding

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Through its Cultural Funding and Awards Programs, the City of Ottawa annually supports the creation, production and presentation of arts, festival, fair and heritage activities undertaken by individuals and not-for-profit professional organizations, as well as, community and amateur groups. The wide range of programs funded by the City creates opportunities for awareness and appreciation of the arts and culture in our community for everyone.

Direct funding to cultural organizations is the most cost-effective way to ensure the delivery of quality cultural activities to the community. Annual income/expense studies of the local, non-profit cultural sector from 2006 to 2010 show the direct leveraging effect of one municipal dollar of investment to be in the range of \$6.28 to \$11.70.<sup>1</sup>

“Culture plays a central role in cities, contributing positively to economic indicators, social cohesion measures, environmental initiatives, quality-of-life, prosperity, happiness and health. International capital cities consistently increase their attention to culture, ensuring that local and national culture are supported and employed to market and attract visitors, businesses and new residents.”<sup>2</sup>

The City of Ottawa’s Cultural Funding and Awards Programs are assessed through a peer review process. Professionals representing specific disciplines and other individuals who are knowledgeable and active in the arts, heritage, festivals or fairs communities are involved in the assessment of applications and allocation of funds.

**In 2013, the Cultural Funding Support Section managed 496 funding and awards submissions, held 31 juries and used 5 independent assessors, that resulted in 309 funding allocations.**

The Partnership Program for Major Festivals and Fairs supports major local festivals and fairs that have city-wide impact, are held annually for two consecutive days or more and have a budget of over \$30,000.

Festivals and Fairs enrich the lives of residents and visitors alike through the presentation of a wide variety of activities that increase understanding and appreciation of the unique character of our community. Festivals and Fairs celebrate our cultural heritage, and shine a spotlight on contemporary artists and art forms.

# firestone collection of canadian art management agreement

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Originally established by Ottawa residents O.J. and Isobel Firestone in the early 1950s, the Firestone Collection of Canadian Art is a significant collection of works that spans the modern period (1900-1980).

In 1972, the Firestone family donated their collection to the Ontario Heritage Foundation. In 1992, the Foundation transferred ownership of this collection to the City of Ottawa with custodianship given to the Ottawa Art Gallery.

The Ottawa Art Gallery receives a purchase of service grant each year to care for, manage and exhibit the City-owned Firestone Collection of Canadian Art.

# pilot program for youth training initiatives

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As part of the *City of Ottawa's Renewed Action Plan for Arts, Heritage and Culture in Ottawa* (2013 – 2018), Strategy 1, *Celebrate Ottawa's Unique Cultural Identity and Provide Access to Culture for All*, Action 4, **Nurture and Empower Ottawa's Youth**.

This Pilot Program was established to provide incentives to existing cultural organizations to develop and provide training opportunities, internships, apprenticeships and work placement programs for youth and to promote existing initiatives that foster youth awareness around careers in culture.
