The City has submitted applications and is waiting on results for the following programs:

- 1. Community Sport and Recreation Infrastructure Fund Stream 1
- 2. FCM Sustainable Municipal Buildings

Community Sport and Recreation Infrastructure Fund - Stream 1

The Community Sport and Recreation Infrastructure Fund, Stream 1, provides funding for projects that repair or upgrade existing sport and recreation facilities.

The City of Ottawa has requested \$1,000,000 to fund the replacement of two community wading pools (Overbrook and Greenboro).

FCM - Sustainable Municipal Buildings

The Sustainable Municipal Buildings program offers funding for high-efficiency new construction of municipal and community buildings, as well as retrofits of municipal buildings.

The City of Ottawa has requested \$50,000 to study the Feasibility of designing a new Riverside South Community Centre and Library Branch to Net Zero.

FCM – Local Leadership in Climate Adaptation

The Local Leadership for Climate Adaptation (LLCA) initiative provides funding support to local governments to adapt and build long-term resiliency to the impacts of climate change.

Through the Adaptation in Action intake, the City of Ottawa has requested \$614,250 to complete a project that will manage uncontrolled stormwater runoff in the Dovercourt Parking Lot.

Green and Inclusive Community Buildings

The Green and Inclusive Community Buildings program objective is to support green and accessible retrofits, repairs, or upgrades to existing public community buildings and the construction of new publicly accessible community buildings that serve high-needs, underserved communities across Canada.

The City of Ottawa has requested \$664,611 to complete a mechanical and electrical system retrofit project at the Carlingwood Library.

Housing Enabling Core Servicing Stream

The Housing Enabling Core Servicing Stream aims to help municipalities build, maintain and repair municipal roads, bridges, and culverts. These projects will unlock new housing opportunities and ensure communities have safe and reliable roadways and transit infrastructure.

The City of Ottawa has requested \$13,650,000 towards the Greenbank Road expansion project.

Housing Enabling Water Systems Fund

The Housing Enabling Water Systems Fund aims to protect communities by investing in the repair, rehabilitation and expansion of core water, wastewater, and stormwater projects to promote growth and enable housing.

The City of Ottawa has requested \$22,238,251.06 towards the reconstruction of the Carlington Heights Pumping Station.

Zero Emission Vehicle Infrastructure Program

The Zero Emission Vehicle Infrastructure Program addresses the lack of charging and hydrogen refueling stations in Canada by increasing the availability of localized charging and hydrogen refueling opportunities where Canadians live, work, travel, and play.

The City of Ottawa has requested \$170,000 towards the expansion of the City's Public EV Charger Network, and \$430,000 towards the City's Fleet EV Charging Infrastructure.
