

- Weston Park from Saunderson Drive to Pleasant Park Road
- Pleasant Park Road & Valley Drive Intersection
- Valley Drive from Pleasant Park Road to Foley Avenue

Project Overview

This is Phase 2 of the Valley Drive Storm Sewer Trunk Rehabilitation project. The work is required to upgrade infrastructure that has reached the end of its service life. Construction for Phase 1 of the project, which included St. Laurent Boulevard from Walkley Road to Foley Avenue, and Foley Avenue, was completed in the fall of 2020. Phase 2 of the project includes the following works:

- storm sewer trunk replacement on Valley Drive and through Weston Park.
- sanitary sewer replacement on Valley Drive from Foley Avenue to Pleasant Park Road.
- watermain replacement on Valley Drive from Foley Avenue to Pleasant Park Road.
- full road reconstruction on Valley Drive with new sidewalk.
- traffic calming measures on Valley Drive.
- intersection improvements at Pleasant Park Road and Valley Drive.

Why This Project Is Important

To Help Alleviate Future Flooding and Basement Backups

The existing storm sewer trunk is shallow relative to basement levels. The new storm sewer will be built significantly lower than the existing. This will improve drainage on the road and for resident foundation drains, thus reducing the risk of surface and basement flooding in the area.

To Improve Road Features and Enhance Traffic Calming

Full road reconstruction will be completed bringing road features up to current City standards, including traffic calming measures for improved community safety.



Anticipated Construction Impacts and Timing

Traffic Management During Construction

- There will be disruptions to traffic flow, however, local traffic access will be maintained throughout construction.
- Driveway access will be temporarily restricted for residences at times when construction is directly in front of driveways. When driveway access is not possible, on-street parking passes will be provided to residents.
- The intersection of Pleasant Park Road and Valley Drive will have to be closed for about 12 weeks in 2023. This is in order to complete the extensive underground work in that area.
 Transit Route 49 on Pleasant Park Road will be locally detoured. Notice of the closure and transit detour will be provided.
- The City is working to minimize traffic impacts.



Bus Route 49 Detour

- 3 month duration in 2023 construction season
- Temporary westbound bus stop at SE corner of Pleasant Park Road and Saunderson Drive
- Parking restrictions on Saunderson Drive





Anticipated Construction Impacts and Timing

Construction Impacts on Property

- As a result of construction and new design features, there will be impacts to the City's Right of Way in front of properties within the project area. Some of these impacts will include:
 - The removal and replacement of grass, trees, shrubs and fences. The project team is working
 with Forestry Services and new trees will be planted as part of the landscaping design.
 - Short temporary water and sewer disruptions.
- The southwest area of Weston Park will be closed for up to 6 months during construction, including
 access to the bocce ball and volleyball courts. Access to the park from Pleasant Park Road and
 Saunderson Drive will not be available during this time.
- The construction is within the City's property, but may result in some disruption to part of the private property directly adjacent to the work. The City will reinstate all sections of landscaping, driveways and walkways that are disturbed by construction.

Anticipated Construction Impacts and Timing

Construction Schedule

- Part 1 (Valley Drive from Foley Ave to north of Goren Avenue) June to December 2021
 Construction Start Notices will be distributed prior to contractor commencing work.
- Part 2 (Valley Drive from north of Goren Avenue to north of Drew Avenue)
 April to December 2022
- Part 3 (Valley Drive north of Drew Avenue to Pleasant Park Road, through Weston Park to Saunderson Drive) April 2023 to July 2024 (including a winter shutdown period)

Part 2 and Part 3 timing will require confirmation from 2022 and 2023 City budget approval process.

- The construction contract is expected to be tendered in spring 2021.
