

Canada Community Revitalization Fund

The Canada Community Revitalization Fund (CCRF) provided \$500 million over two years to help communities across Canada revitalize and build new infrastructure and bring people back together, supporting connection and recreation that are integral to mental and physical well-being.

The program funded projects that aimed to revitalize downtown cores and main streets, reinvent outdoor spaces, create green infrastructure, and increase the accessibility of community spaces.

The City of Ottawa was approved for \$3,743,415 from the Government of Canada through the <u>Federal Economic Development Agency</u> <u>for Southern Ontario</u> (FedDev Ontario).
