

Canada 150 Community Infrastructure Program

The <u>Canada 150 Community Infrastructure Program</u> (CIP 150) was a \$150 million Federal government funding program that invested in projects that involved renovating, expanding, and improving community infrastructure across the nation. It was part of Canada 150 Celebrates, marking and celebrating Canada's 150th anniversary of Confederation.

The CIP 150 initiative enhanced parks and recreation facilities to provide community space for Canada 150 celebrations, as well as build a long term legacy for fostering community involvement and sustainability.

The City of Ottawa was approved for \$2,892,000 from the Government of Canada through the Federal Economic Development Agency for Southern Ontario.

The CIP 150 program closed in 2018.
